LITURGY LINGO

What is liturgy and why should I care?

Liturgy contains the story of salvation—for you! The words of Confession and Absolution, readings from Holy Scripture, and Creeds tell of God's loving acts throughout history. *Lamb of God, You take away the sin of the world* isn't just a reading from John 1:29—it's our confession of who Jesus is and what He does.

Liturgy is not a page in a book. Textual and musical variations occur between denominations and even congregations and are neither commanded nor forbidden by Scripture. Decisions on textual and musical changes are informed by historical practice, Scriptural integrity, and thoughtful conversation—with the goal of joining all God's people together in receiving His redeeming work in Christ.


 → Son and of the Holy Spirit.
