CHURCH MUSIC Q&A

Actual questions for Cantor Soulek with his actual answers.

What is "singing in canon" and why do we do it?

The hymn after the children's message (on page 5) will invite you to sing in canon – another word for singing in a round. One group begins the stanza, and another comes in a few beats later. The organ will demonstrate this with the introduction to the hymn. If you notice someone singing confidently close to you, follow their lead! Singing in canon helps us receive the words of the hymn in a different way. May our care encircle all...

Why does the organ or piano stop playing when we're singing?

Occasionally it's to take care of a problem with an instrument (or the person playing it). More often it's to show that the congregation is the most important choir – and to give the opportunity for you to better embrace that role. *Creator, humbly I implore You...*

Why do we slow down when the organ drops out?

Great follow up question! Our ears wait for others to finish a phrase before we start the next one; when several hundred people do this together, each phrase takes longer than the one before it. Try releasing the note a bit earlier and taking a good solid breath if you'd like to counteract this phenomenon. The gathered assembly is an eclectic group of all ages and abilities – the goal is participation over perfection.

Why does the choir sing stanzas of hymns?

Sometimes we plan choir stanzas to give the congregation vocal rest – an 8 or 10 stanza hymn can be a lot of singing! Sometimes we plan choir stanzas to give the congregation a different perspective on a text. Since choirs have the opportunity to rehearse, they present settings (arrangements) of a text/tune that might not be practical for several hundred people to try at once. Today's choral settings were written by Cantor Soulek (God of Grace), J.S. Bach (Jesus, Priceless Treasure) and Paul Manz (Oh, That I Had a Thousand Voices). Each composer uses different ideas and techniques to bring out the unique hymn text.




